

Research Objectives


- Are users able to clearly interpret a coin's current price and market trend over different time intervals using the graph?
- Are users able to navigate the Token Menu to successfully change quote tokens and pairings between differing trading coins?
- Are users able to navigate the Trade Menu to place both market and limit orders?
- Can novice users understand the value of the Order Book and Open Orders?

Participants

- Thirteen one-on-one remote interviews running between 25 – 40 minutes in duration
- 4 Novice users, 7 users with moderate familiarity, 2 expert users
- Participants used screensharing to vocalize and demonstrate how they'd accomplish tasks and their reeactions to app features









Interacting with the Price Chart to understand current market trends Navigating Token Menu and Trade Menu to place a Market Order

Browsing the Order Book and Placing a Limit Order Screenshot

Are users able to clearly interpret a coin's current price and market trend over different time intervals using the graph?



Participants lacked confidence in interpreting particular market trends due to unclear and missing graph features

Participants were able to interpret the coin's market's trend over different time intervals, however, they struggled to:

- interpret the **significance of moving dashed** line
- discern what the time increment "All" included
- understand the relationship between selected time increment and X-axis
- understand why the chart **prices** did not change in real time
- avoid feeling **overwhelmed** by the granular data the chart displays

"You want me to compare two coins? I would just have t**wo charts** open, I guess. -P1

- Addition of help icon with modal for graph "key" so that participants can understand what each type of line on the chart signifies
- Include a help icon with explanation as to why the chart isn't updated in real time
- Inclusion of currency and time values on chart axises



Price Chart: Participants desired more interactive and informative visual elements.

Objective 2: Are users able to clearly interpret a coin's market trend over different time intervals?

I don't know if that's a good or bad thing, but **typically**, I look at graphs [...] and as you **zoom out**, **the precision tends to get less coarse**. -P1

- **expected** a less granular precision on line graph, preferring a **smoother line**
- pound the significance of moving dashed line to be confusing and unintuitive
- expected to be able to scroll in order to zoom in and out of the chart
- **expected** to see **units** for all values on x and y axis of chart

- Alter line graph so that as timeframe broadens, precision decreases
- Inclusion of feature to scroll in and out
- Inclusion of currency and time values on chart axises
- Addition of help icon with modal for graph "key" so that participants can understand what each type of line on the chart signifies



Price Chart: Participants desired more options for time intervals.

Objective 2: Are users able to clearly interpret a coin's market trend over different time intervals?

- all expertise levels expected or desired to see time increments between "3 months" and "All"
- high expertise ppts desired **smaller increments** for short-term trading
- uncertain about what timeframe "All" included
- moderate to high level expertise ppts desired the option to define a **specific** range of time

1 DAY 1 WEEK 1 MONTH 3 MONTHS ALL

Recommendations

- "6 Months" and "1 Year" time interval option
- "Half day" and "Quarter day" time interval
- option to input a range of time (date/hourly increments) to view
- inclusion of help icon with modal that defines what time "All" encompasses

"I would like to see [...] one day, one week, one month, three months, **six months, one year** and then there's this option to click a range, like **a specific range**." -P7

"Have half a day, quarter day for short-term traders" -P8

Price Chart: Participants with *higher expertise* desired inclusion of more technical elements.

Objective 2: Are users able to clearly interpret a coin's market trend over different time intervals?

- desired to see more technical features in general
- desired to see candlestick charts
- desired to see **volume bars**


Recommendations

- Addition feature which allows user to opt in and out of including technical features on price chart
 - include candlesticks
 - include volume bars

If they want it to be like a very active trading platform [...] I feel like that feature would have to be more advanced. [...] I like to use candlestick charts. So, if that were an option, that would be cool. -P8

One thing I would appreciate here is having **volume bars.**-P7

Are users able to navigate the Token Menu to successfully change quote tokens and pairings between differing trading coins?



Participants struggled to find & were hesitant to interact with the Token Menu


Both experienced and novice participants **struggled** to find the Token Menu.

• Participants tried to click on token icons next to "price" in the Trade Menu to try and access Token Menu.

Some participants demonstrated hesitancy when inside the Token Menu


- The term "Quote Token" was an unfamiliar term to both experienced and novice participant
- Participants thought they could search for other non-listed coins using the "Search by Token"

- Provide multiple option to access Token Menu
- Consider using more common terminology
- Consider removing "Search by Token" if only few tokens available



Are users able to navigate the Trade

Menu to place both market and limit orders?




During market buys many participants were confused and frustrated when unable to enter an amount into "Price" field

Participants tried to type in the amount of USDC they wanted to pay for Ethereum in the "price" field and were confused when unable to do so.


- Previous experience in other crypto trading platforms influenced this assumption
- Other participants assumed that the same visual design between "Price" and "Quantity" indicated the same interaction functionality

Participants expressed frustration and uncertainty when having to enter the "Quantity" since it forced them to do mental math or use an external calculator

- Consider multiple points of entry for changing price and quantity
- Use visual cues to express difference in "Price" & "Quantity" functionality
- Incorporate labeling to assist novice users



Can novice users
understand the value of

Open Orders?




Most participants lacked confidence in interpreting the Order Book & Open Orders due to a lack of labeling & information

- Participants were **uncertain** of how the Order Book information was populated
- Participants could not identify value of green number and dot
- Participants guessed what each number represented and wished there were labels to assist them
- "Pair" confusion between what was traded
- Uncertainty of what cancelling would do, is that a button?

Participants consistently called out desire to have numbers and quantities **labeled with units**

Recommendations

- Add unit labels and dates consistently
- Use consistent language for assets (Price, quanitity, size)
- Clarify where information populates from and who's info it is



Participants misinterpreted the Open Orders columns and questioned functionality



- Participants could not **identify** value of green number and dot
- Questioned the value of the info link for date
- "Pair" confusion between what was traded
- Uncertainty of what **cancelling** would do, is that a button?

"I'm assuming if you hover on the cancel, you might get more information? Maybe an option to see the time left to cancel, or modify?" - P1

"It's also very confusing what's going on. Like what is size? What the size of what? There's no units, there's no dollar signs anywhere. It's super unclear what anything means." - P4

"Knowing that's a link, I really don't know what else I need to know about the date that that would link out to" P2

- Add units and keep labeling consistent
- Consider reframing or additional info for "Pair" column

Summary of Recommendations



- Repurpose help icon for assistive text and modals (graph "key", terminology definitions, source info) to avoid user error and unexpected navigation outside of platform
- © Consider additional icon for links out of platform interface to signify when a user will leave platform
- \$ Label units, currency, and components whenever possible to assist novice users
- Consider multiple points of entry for input and access to drop down menus to avoid errors and frustration
- Use consistent language for assets (Price, quantity, size) to increase understanding of expected behavior
- Use additional visual cues to express differences in fields ("Price" vs. "Quantity") to help users unfamiliar with language

Future Research Opportunities





Test functionality of additional pages that were out of scope in this study, especially those that caught user attention of the current studies participants



Recruit users who actively trade with Rubicon to gain active user insights into what's working and pain points, and gain a better understanding of what users are seeking from a layer 2 cryptocurrency trading platform
